# Village first in the queue for HS2 cash

A small village in South Warwickshire is the first parish to receive a funding grant from HS2 which will benefit community life.

The successful £75,000 bid jointly from Wormleighton Parochial Church Council (PCC) and Wormleighton Parish Meeting for HS2 Community and Environment Fund (CEF) money will pay for kitchen and toilet facilities to be installed at the village church which will open it up for wider secular community use.

Fund managers Groundwork announced that a total of £245,000 has been allocated to community projects along the HS2 route to date, with Wormleighton receiving the single largest sum and a third of the total awarded in the first round of grants.

St Peter's Church is the only building in Wormleighton with capacity for larger events where people can get together socially. It currently does not have basic facilities for visitors. The bid been a joint team effort by the PCC led by Isabella Moore and Irvin Klegerman, Chair of the Parish Meeting.

# Extra HS2 funding for safer roads

Warwickshire
County Council
has welcomed
the confirmation
of extra funding
to deal with road
safety issues
around HS2affected highways.



The Department for Transport (DfT) has announced that £30 million will be allocated to towns and villages along the HS2 route to help improve road and cycle safety and off-set disruption caused by the railway.

Warwickshire will receive an allocation of £8 million to be spent on schemes by the end of 2026. The funding can be used for traffic calming measures, safer pedestrian crossings or safer junctions for cyclists, pedestrians and drivers.

There are stringent DfT guidelines in place for local authorities to consider which schemes will be applicable to receive the funding. Authorities must also ensure that improvement schemes leave a lasting legacy of road safety.

The group, HS2LANC, was the winner of the Noise Abatement Society John Connell Local Authority Award, presented by Thérèse Coffey MP, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Defra.



### Phase 2a update

The hybrid bill to build Phase 2a of HS2 from Birmingham to Crewe has received a Second Reading in the House of Commons.

MPs debated the principle and the need for the scheme which will proceed to Select Committee stage, due to begin in the spring.

HS2 Ltd has published its policy documents covering property compensation and environmental surveys for Phase 2b.

More detail on the Phase 2b scheme is expected later in the year. The target date for depositing a bill in Parliament to build the Birmingham to Leeds section is late 2019.
