121. REPRESENTATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

Mr K Currell – 4 Orchard Way, Southam

Spoke regarding the proposed fence at the Tollgate Road Open Space, stating that what was proposed was unacceptable, having met with the MP would like to propose a working party to discuss a shared use arrangement, have an enforceable 'No Dogs' policy, there is a shared use situation at Napton School and that works fine.

Mr Upton, 18 Drovers Way, Southam

Spoke regarding the proposed 'Emergency Stopping Place' on the A425, wanted to ascertain whether it was a public highway and if so then it should not have been gated off.

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Mr Batchelder, 16 Tollgate Road, Southam

Spoke regarding the Tollgate Road Playing Field, stating that what was being proposed was unacceptable, that Southam already has a deficit of open space and that although it is accepted that the school requires a safe area there is a difference between the schools aspirations and the requirements of the National Curriculum. The park has now been recognised as a community asset, but by enclosing the majority of the space it is contrary to the benefit and aims of the Localism Act legislation, the proposals do not take into account the current and future needs of the whole community and shared access needs to be pursued and therefore the Town Council should vote against and reject the current proposal.

Mr Rowley, 1 Drovers Way, Southam

Spoke regarding the 'Emergency Stopping Place' on the A425 stating that if this chipping store was part of the public highway, then it should never have been gated off and planning should not have been granted for a 'Gypsy Site'

Mr D Woods, 28 Tollgate Road, Southam

Spoke regarding the Tollgate Road Playing field, agreed with the other representations, that the Town Council should reject the proposal and keep the park as it is.

Mr M Houston, 24 Tollgate Road, Southam

Spoke regarding the Tollgate Road Open Space, that shared use is the best way forward, as an experienced PE Teacher it is better for Primary School pupils to work in smaller areas, a football pitch is not required, as small team games are carried out and facilities at Southam College should be utilised.

Mrs Daly, 62 Banbury Road, Southam

Spoke regarding speeding on Banbury Road, speeding traffic has been going on for years with nothing being done about it, path is very close to the road and it is terrifying, and it's extremely difficult getting in and out of driveways, please advise what can be done about it.

Mr T Cribbit, 26 Tollgate Road, Southam

Spoke regarding the Tollgate Road Playing Field, is opposed to the proposal, that the 32m is a dog run and it leaves no space for games, that the space should be shared and the whole area fenced off.

Mrs S Healey, Banbury Road, Southam

Reiterated the concerns regarding speeding traffic along Banbury Road and stated that something needed to be done about the roundabout at the shell garage it is very overgrown and you cannot see what traffic is coming.

Mrs Batchelder, 16 Tollgate Road, Southam

Residents have never denied that the school need a safe space, but members of the public use it as well as parents who stop after school, the school would only use the fenced area 32% of the year, the shared use is an option that should be investigated further, volunteers are willing to help with the logistics and the MP is willing to facilitate a meeting.

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Mrs K Woods, 28 Tollgate Road, Southam

Spoke regarding the Tollgate Road Playing Field, is opposed to the proposal, it cannot be justified that St James is given such a large space, parents knew what facilities the school had when they chose to send their children there, the community space is a vital resource and it should be recognised that the town has a deficit of public open space.

Mrs D Smith, 20 Springs Crescent, Southam

Wanted to know if someone had been out to look at the drainage problem in Tomwell Close, that the resurfacing along Welsh Road East, was it something to do with the planning conditions for that road, with regards to footpath and cycle ways.

Mr Hedge, 65 Banbury Road, Southam

Spoke concerning the speeding along Banbury Road, reiterated that something needs to be done about it.

Mrs V Justice, 58 Banbury Road, Southam

Spoke about speeding along Banbury Road, that it is a dangerous road and something needs to be done.

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iv)Mr Rowly and Mr Upton were advised that the area along the A425 that is being used as a chipping store is classed as a public highway and should not have been gated off and that WCC will need to get a gating order to make changes to the use of this land v)Mrs Healy was advised that the overgrown vegetation on the roundabout near to the Shell Garage, will be reported to WCC

Members were advised that WCC had made it very clear to the Town Clerk that they were not prepared to give either the school or the Town Council any more space and that if the school refused to accept the proposal then WCC would install a fence themselves, as they had a duty as an Education Authority regarding the safeguarding of children.
