### 109.1 PUBLIC REPRESENTATIONS

### 109.2 COUNCILLOR RESIGNATION

Members were advised that letters of resignation had been received from Mrs Lesley Smith and Mr J Smith. SDC has advised that as we are now within six months of the Southam all-out elections, there is no allowance to advertise the vacancy for an election to be requested. Therefore, the Town Council considered whether to co-opt to fill the vacancies or leave the positions vacant.

### 109.3 SPEEDING ON BANBURY ROAD

Members considered further correspondence from residents complaining about speeding traffic along Banbury Rd. The Town Council last considered correspondence from the resident in September 2014 and as such the Council resolved the following:

#### **RESOLVED:**

i) At this moment in time, Members decided not to fund the installation of such signs ii) To ask the Police to provide a report regarding speeding in the town as a whole, in order to consider at the Precept Meeting if a 'speed initiative' project is required and at what cost.

WCC advised that a feasibility study regarding speeding for the town would cost in the region of £6000, the Police advised that they had met with the resident and discussed a Community Speed Watch initiative, there would need to be 6 volunteers who would be trained to use the equipment and the resident has indicated that they would be happy to volunteer.

### **RESOLVED:**

- i) That the Town Council fully supports PC Cramp's Community Speed Watch initiative and is happy to assist in the initiative where possible, once the project is up and running PC Cramp will feedback to the Council.
- ii)That a Traffic Management Line is added to the 2015/16 budget iii)That the Town Clerk writes to Ron Ball regarding the speeding issues in Southam and ask for additional resources to help tackle the problem.

### 109.4 SOUTHAM BURIAL GROUND

Members considered correspondence from the Bishop of Coventry, in response to a letter that was sent on behalf of the Council seeking a meeting with the Bishop, in order to ascertain the current position and whether the diocese has land that maybe suitable. The diocese advised that they would prefer to meet after their planning applications have been considered. The diocese also sent the Council a petition they have received from a resident, asking the Church to rectify the problem, the letter states "The Church seems to sell an awful lot of land, why not use some of this land for a new graveyard/cemetery". **Noted** 

### 109.5 THE HOLY WELL

The Town Clerk has been discussing the issue of water seepage causing algae to form and thus making the flagstones dangerously slippery with English Heritage, in order to agree a course of action to rectify the problem. Members considered correspondence from English Heritage outlining the proposed work and a quote from an English Heritage approved local contractor. The Town Clerk recommended to the Council to apply to English Heritage to carry out the proposed works using the approved contractor, advising that this contractor is extremely experienced working with ancient monuments and that some of the issues that have arisen with The Holy Well have been due to poor workmanship in the past, therefore it is extremely important that an experienced contractor is used to carry out the necessary work and maintain The Holy Well in the future. The cost of the proposed work is approximately £7k, there is £3400 remaining in The Holy Well grant budget. It is envisaged that the work would not be carried out until next spring; in the meantime Schedule Monument Consent needs to be applied for and that can take up to 2 months to process.

#### **RESOLVED:**

- i) To carry out the recommended work using the approved local contractor at a cost of approximately £7000
- ii)To utilise the remaining funds in The Holy Well Grant Budget and precept for the balance
- iii)To ascertain if there is any grant funding available
- iv) That the approved local contractor maintains The Holy Well in the future

### 109.6 TOLLGATE ROAD PLAYING FIELD

Members were advised that the fence for those residents that back onto the Tollgate Road Playing Field has now been replaced, the residents are extremely pleased and two letters have been sent to the Council, thanking the Council for providing a strong well-built fence and saying how pleased and impressed they were with the contractor. The school fence dividing the field has also been installed and work is currently being carried out on the school part of the field.

Southam Town Council is of the opinion that the proposed modification does not address our concerns; therefore we would request that this point is amended to read:

That the Area of Restraint should be protected from all development and be preserved as a Country Park for the benefit of the residents of Southam and visitors to the Town.
