141. TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

141.1 PUBLIC REPRESENTATIONS

i)Mrs Childs was advised that the Town Council has not resolved to become a Burial Authority, but this would be considered if there is an option for land. That if a referendum took place, it would explain in as much detail as possible regarding the costs of the burial ground. That the possibility of the Stowe Valley becoming a Country Park is a long term objective and would probably form part of the Neighbourhood Plan.

ii)Mr Riches was advised that the matter of street naming would be considered later in the meeting. That the Town Council does have delegated powers in relation to street naming and that it is the policy of SDC to administer it. SDC wrote to the Town Council asking them to decide what they want to name the streets. iii)Miss Zawoda was advised that the street naming policy was introduced in 2009 and that it normally gets reviewed at the start of every Council term. That she is welcome to have a copy of the policy booklet, which is not on the website as additional policies need adding to it. The Council in office at the time resolved to support the project relating to the dart player, that was the decision of the Council at that time. Street naming will be considered later in the meeting. iv)Mr Bromwich was advised that street naming will be considered later in the

meeting.

v)Mr Wise was advised that as far as the Council is aware the refurbishment of Market Hill is going ahead as planned, but dates were yet to be confirmed.

143. BURIAL GROUND WORKING PARTY REPORT BACKGROUND

1. The Town Council has considered becoming a burial authority and is minded to do so however a formal resolution confirming this status is still required.

CONSULTATIONS

- 2. Two potential sites have been identified in Southam and discussions are taking place with landowners concerning use for this purpose and possible easing/purchase arrangements.
- 3. These sites have direct access from main roads thereby reducing infrastructure costs.

THE WAY FORWARD

- 4. If and when a site has been agreed investigations will need to be made into suitability of location, land contours, drainage and environmental aspects and planning requirements.
- 5. These investigations will require professional expertise/advice and funding from Town Council.
- 6. If the Town Council resolves to ascertain public opinion on the type of burial ground, and this is relevant to the investigation in 4. it will require a Parish Poll (Referendum) and the cost will be around £ 2000 and organised and implemented by Stratford District Council. It has been confirmed that this Poll cannot be included with any elections process i.e. May 2015.
- 7. If a Town Poll supports the provision and funding of a burial site by the Town Council and the ongoing management, and when a possible site has been confirmed and is available either by gift or purchase the Town Council will then have to decide if it is prepared to resolve to become a Burial Authority with the ongoing future responsibilities that entails.
- 8. Should it resolve to do this extra funding may be required for the project to move forward and funds provided by the Public Works Loan fund. The support for this will already have been confirmed or not by the Town Referendum.
- 9. Prior to a loan application the detailed planning can commence, funded by the Town Council, including the planning process, costing of works including purchase of land and infrastructure. When these details are in place the application process for the loan to the Public Works Loan Board can start.

The Advisory Board of the Children's centre met on Wednesday Jan 14th 2015 at Arundel House. This Group includes representatives from partner agencies, Head Teachers, users of the Children's Centre, representatives from WCC, Health Agencies, Children's Centre Manager and Administrator and representatives of The Parenting Project who now deliver the Service. The role of the Advisory Board is, as its name suggests, to advise, support, challenge and inform the strategic decision making processes of the Centre.

The Children's Centre have now moved from the Graham Adams Centre, and relocated on Coventry Street, where they are renting the ground floor of Arundel House as office space and The Barn where their main services are delivered. Currently they are settling in and are running a programme.

At present there is no outside space for activities due to health & Safety issues posed by the area. It is envisaged that an outside space for activities will be developed.

There is an open day at the premises on Wednesday January 28th from 10.00am - 2.00pm
