# 141.2 THE ASSETS OF COMMUNITY VALUE (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2012, FORMER POLICE STATION AND COURT BUILDING, SOUTHAM, WK 443009

Members considered correspondence from SDC advising that Tony Perks has considered the Council's nomination and concluded that the property should not be added to the Assets of Community Value List. The reasoning is that for Section 88 (2) of the Localism Act 2011 (Test B) requires the specific use of the building to be of community value in order for an asset to be listed. The provision of a police station and court facilities is a statutory function that can only be carried out by the Police or other relevant authorities and no other organisation or party can operate this function within the building. Therefore, because it is no longer so operated it is not capable of listing.

#### Minutes of the Play Area Development Working Party on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2019

#### **143.1 Item 1 – HAGS**

Following the meeting the Working Party had with HAGS on the 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018 it was agreed that £15k would be withheld due to issues with the train roof. Compensation was discussed and a figure of £5k was considered. Members were asked to consider whether we wanted monetary value or additional play equipment up to the value.

Following the meeting it was agreed that we would have some additional equipment, the Clerk has written to HAGS regarding this, but they have not come back to me.

It's been nearly 4 months since our meeting and HAGS have made no contact with me regarding the Train roof or the £15k.

Members are requested to consider what action if any should be taken

#### **RESOLVED:**

i)Not to chase

ii)If HAGS do replace the train roof and ask for the £15k payment renegotiate compensation

#### 143.2 <u>Item 2 – S106 Monies</u>

The total amount of S106 monies for Play Areas /Public Open Spaces are as follows:

Taylor Wimpey Cov Rd site - £62,192.10 Convent - £5059.91 Bloor Homes - £101,803.68

The total cost of HAGS was 89, 652.64 less £15k therefore paying £74 652.64

To pay this all the Taylor Wimpey money was used and the balance came from Bloor Homes therefore the balances are as follows:

Taylor Wimpey – NIL Convent - £5059.91(Town Council is holding this money) Bloor Homes - £89, 343.14 (SDC are holding this money)

Members were asked to decide what action should be taken regarding the remaining funds, taking into account that the Council do want to have CCTV in Park Lane and the SDC Solicitor has confirmed that these S106 monies can be used for that purpose.

#### **RESOLVED:**

i)To set aside £15k

ii)To set aside £30k for CCTV – It is envisaged that 2 CCTV cameras will be installed in the Park Lane Recreation Ground that is linked to the SDC monitoring system, these will be done as part of the SDC CCTV upgrade which is hoped to be done in the next 18 months

iii)That a budget of £60k is set aside to make improvements to the following play areas:

Tollgate Road Priors Meadow Ascote Way The Furrows

iv)To contact Play Equipment companies and seek quotes (do not use HAGS due to poor performance in a previous contract)

Members were asked to consider quotes received to resurface the path in Merestone Park.

i)To accept the quote from Cooper Surfacing Ltd at a cost of £18, 960 + VAT

Excavate and remove existing surface to allowance.
Treat and Weed-killer and compact to required levels
Lay Breedon Golden Amber Gravel at 75mm compacted to 50 mm
Repairs timber edges where appropriate

ii)This company is on the WCC Accredited Street Works Contractor List and has carried out work for Warwick Castle

iii)As advised the work would not be carried out until Spring 2019 iv)The work will be funded from using the £15k held in Ear Marked Reserves for the Merestone Park Path and £5k from Budget Line 34 Footpaths Play Areas
